RE: Washington Voters Oppose Impeachment

Despite a steady disapproval of President Bush's job performance in 2007, a majority of likely voters in Washington State oppose impeachment of the President today.

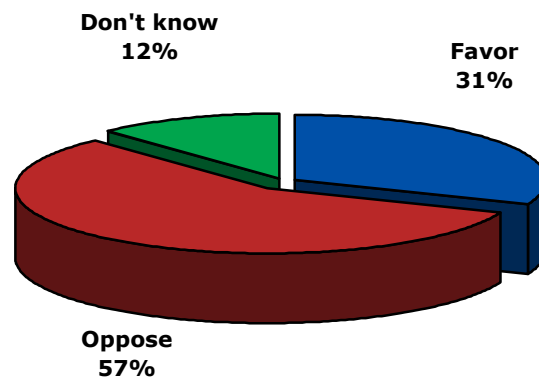
Findings

An October survey of likely Washington voters reveals that a majority oppose impeachment of President Bush (57%), while fewer than one-third favor it (31%) and the remaining voters are undecided (12%).

These results are not significantly different than those reported in a national survey by Gallup/USA Today (July 2007), when 62% said there was no justification for Congress to start impeachment proceedings against President Bush, compared to 36% who said there was justification.

Impeachment of President Bush

Bush's impeachment is opposed throughout the state, except in Seattle. Republican voters almost universally oppose impeachment and a majority of Independents agree. However, among Democrats, 60% favor impeachment while 28% are opposed.

The survey was conducted October 6-7, 2007 among a representative sample of 500 likely registered voters in Washington State. Potential sampling error is plus or minus 4% at the 95% confidence level.

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
